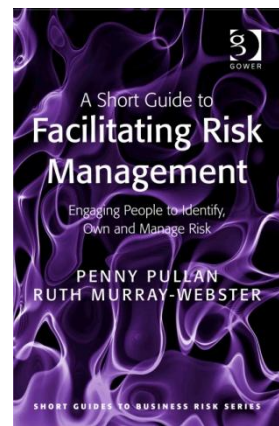




Risk Facilitation Skills Workshop, with Penny Pullan and Ruth Murray-Webster 21-22nd March 2012



Learning Outcomes:

Participants will leave this event with:

1. a clear understanding of how to facilitate the risk management process - both in and out of workshops;
2. experience of facilitating key parts of the process, along with copious feedback on what works well and how they could be even better;
3. the knowledge of what approaches work when in the risk management process;
4. their next risk session prepared for in full;
5. a working understanding of:
 - conflict in groups and how to harness it;
 - a variety of ways of idea generation, prioritisation and decision-making;
 - running risk management processes in both face-to-face and virtual settings, with cross-cultural challenges;
 - building ownership and engagement throughout the risk process.
6. the knowledge and experience to avoid common pitfalls, including:
 - over-focus on threats,
 - 'tick-box' use of risk register,
 - people not taking ownership of their risks,
 - poor at prioritisation,
 - lack of action after risk workshops,
 - going off track and losing focus,
 - some people being dominant and others not contributing,
 - risk workshops being 'boring',
 - day to day delivery squeezing out risk management.



What to expect on this workshop:

You'll spend most of the workshop planning, facilitating and gaining feedback on your risk facilitation skills.

While we'll explore small chunks of content, we'll always apply them as a group immediately, giving you the change to try them out and experience them working in practice.

One thing you won't find on this workshop is 'Death by PowerPoint' as we don't use it. This course is not just about giving you information and knowledge, but focuses on building your experience of the tools and techniques we use.





Of course, you will be in the hands of two experienced facilitators, who will provide a relaxed, safe and friendly environment to make sure everyone is able to develop their skills. We're committed to supporting you with practical, pragmatic tips that work in the real world.



Who is it aimed for?

The pre-requisite for this course is that you have a good understanding of the risk management process (see for example Chapter Two of 'A Short Guide to Facilitating Risk Management by Pullan and Murray-Webster) and that you have at least one risk management process to facilitate over the next few months.

Your job title could be anything from operations manager to project or programme manager, business analyst, risk manager, consultant (internal or external), director, HR professional or Health and Safety manager, or indeed anything else. All that matters is that your role (or part of it) is to get risk management to work through other people. That could mean running meetings or workshops and possibly coordinating other people or giving advice.
